



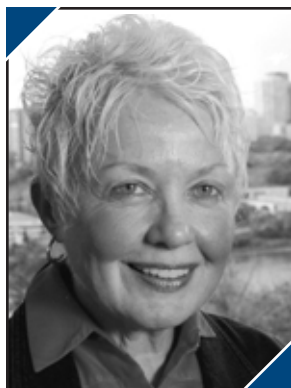

## Planned Events


As our 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary approaches (in 2007), the Society is embarking on several ventures to consolidate and extend our modernization.

### 1. Members and Associates

Institutional Membership now stands at thirty. We will extend the invitation again to universities who are not yet members, offer a range of sponsorship opportunities to Institutional Members in addition to the forums (which may include sponsorship and hosting of the GG Lectures, hosting a regional meeting, or hosting an AGM outside of Ottawa), and lay the groundwork for Corporate Associates of the RSC.

### 2. Meetings and Conferences: Visibility

Thanks to the success of our re-entry to the 2006 Congress, we will work with fellows at the University of Saskatchewan, the site of the 2007 Congress, to develop a cluster of transdisciplinary events around the theme of "Loss on the Prairies," with commentary on the family farm, cultural traditions, and Native languages. The regional meeting at Waterloo has already spurred Bhagirath Singh to start planning the 2007 Southwestern Ontario meeting at Western. Another result is the University of Waterloo's interest in con-celebrating anniversaries with us: Waterloo's 50<sup>th</sup> and our 125<sup>th</sup>, under the auspices of an event at CIGI. We will be inviting specific fellows in every geographic region to collaborate with sister or neighbour institutions to mount a series of regional meetings focused on fellows' research addressing pertinent local issues. With an Organizing Committee consisting of Howard Alper, Ratna Ghosh, John Grace, Sherrill Grace, Janice MacKinnon, Susan McDaniel, Mona Nemer, and me, the Society is mounting an international conference, *Rooms of Their Own: Women in the Knowledge Economy and Society*, to be held at the University of Alberta, May 2-4, 2007; I invite you to visit the conference site [www.crcstudio.arts.ualberta.ca/rsc](http://www.crcstudio.arts.ualberta.ca/rsc) and circulate the Call for Papers to potentially interested colleagues. The first stage of the re-designed site for RSC: The Academies will be live very shortly; our second stage will extend the interactive features to include registration at events.

### ***In Search of Alternatives to Synthetic Pesticides: Eavesdropping on Mother Nature***

#### **Abstract**

Insects cause considerable losses in agricultural and forest ecosystems, as well as vectoring many important diseases of livestock and Man. Synthetic insecticides are still the backbone of many pest management programs, as they are fast acting and can be applied when needed. However, their use/misuse can also result in a number of undesirable effects, which include the development of insecticide resistance in pest species and detrimental impacts on non-target species, including humans. Consequently, we must seek alternative means of control that are acceptable from ecological, economic, and sociological perspectives.

Chemical ecology, despite what one might think when hearing the name, offers such alternatives. This interdisciplinary research field investigates how naturally occurring chemicals mediate interactions within and between species. In my presentation I will give examples of how basic research examining the chemical cues insects use when making decisions about "what to eat", "where to lay eggs" and "with whom to mate" has led to the development of effective means of managing certain pest species.

Thus, listening to Nature's "conversations" will not only give us a greater appreciation of the fascinating world around us, but also provide more eco-friendly ways of controlling pests in the years to come.

Dear Fellows,

Three months ago I sent you my very first Word from the Executive Director. At that time we were busy sending you the ballots for election of new Fellows. It gives me great pleasure to announce that you have elected 82 new Fellows, 2 Foreign Fellows and 1 Specially Elected Fellow (you will find the details within this issue of RSC News).

We have also been busy collecting your membership fees. This year, for the first time ever, the invoices were sent electronically - at least to the 85% or so of Fellows for whom we have an e-mail address (we used regular mail for the others). It has been quite a success; we started receiving payment from many of you the very same day we sent the invoices!

A few Fellows have expressed dissatisfaction at the fee increase, particularly the 65 and over age group for whom the increase was higher. It was Council's unanimous decision last November to raise the fee from \$200 to \$250 for those under the age of 65, half of that amount being applied to those 65 and over - which resulted in a larger percentage increase for Fellows 65 and over. Fellows in attendance at the Annual Business Meeting were given the opportunity to comment on the motion to increase the fees and everyone supported it. RSC's intention is to maintain that ratio of 1:2 in future, and to increase fees annually instead of every several years.

As you know, RSC depends mainly on membership fees to operate the Secretariat. RSC no longer enjoys free rent from the Federal government (as a result, on March 31 of this year we moved to much smaller facilities), and the cost of maintaining member services has increased sharply in the past 10 years. The previous fee increase had occurred in 1994.

In addition to organizing ourselves in the new offices, in the past three months we have also been busy performing a thorough review of membership criteria and issues with the Committee on Fellowship (COF) headed by Past President Gilles Paquet, redefining individual roles and responsibilities within the RSC Secretariat, improving the website, improving nomination forms and processes, drafting a three-year Strategic Plan, and finalizing the annual audit.

The roles and responsibilities of each staff in the Secretariat have been reviewed and finalized. You will find a summary table within this issue of RSC News which should be useful to you when contacting us on a particular issue, or if you simply wish to know what services the Secretariat offers (in other words, where your membership fees go!).

As our President mentioned in her Word from the President, our website is under reconstruction. We think you will like the new colours and the improved navigability as well, of course, as the up-to-date information. The most important new features, however, will be the ability for Fellows to vote for new Fellows electronically, to register and pay on-line for major RSC events, and to share information with other Fellows. It will be a several months before all this is up and running, but by this time next year, the current RSC communications system will be a thing of the past.

To all potential nominators, I am pleased to say that we have recently updated and improved our nomination forms and procedures. You can see the new forms by visiting our website at [www.rsc.ca](http://www.rsc.ca). The revisions included COF's amended criteria for the different categories of Fellows and a new Lifetime Summary Sheet that provides a quantitative overview of a candidate's career achievements. New forms were also developed for nominations to the Arts Division of Academy I.

There is now a draft RSC Strategic Plan for 2006-2009. A first draft was reviewed by the President and Secretariat staff; a second draft will be reviewed by the President's Advisory Council (PAC), August 30; and subsequently by the Executive Committee, September 7. Hopefully, a final version will be endorsed by Council in November, which will provide a much-needed road map to volunteers and staff alike.

The 2005-06 Audit is being finalized. The year ended with a deficit, and the current year (2006-07) is also expected to generate a deficit. From 2007-08, however, we project that deficits, like our current emphasis on paper communications, will be a thing of the past. Elimination of deficits will be due in large measure to the Institutional Membership program which is helping RSC to become financially more sustainable; it will also be due to the internal modernization process underway at RSC.

We want to keep improving services to Fellows in a number of ways. First, RSC News has been beefed up and hopefully will provide you with both more news and news of more interest. Second, we will be working in the coming months to bring up to date a number of publications that fell behind schedule over the past few years. One publication that has been in much demand recently is the RSC Calendar; our intention is to publish an updated Calendar in early 2007.

To publish a new Calendar, however, we must confirm/update the information that we currently have in our database on each one of you. We must also obtain your written consent to publish your personal information in the next issue of the Calendar. We

will be sending you shortly, under separate cover, a request to update your profile and give us permission to circulate it. When you do receive the request, please take a few moments to respond and return the form in the self-addressed envelope that will accompany the request. On the form we will also inform you that, from a certain date onward, we will be communicating with all of you by e-mail and encouraging increased online participation (RSC website searches, online registrations and payment processing, etc.). For those who stipulate on the form that they prefer to continue receiving printed material, we will honour your request.

We have recently assisted the newly renamed Council of Canadian Academies (CCA) in their first-ever study, on the state of Canada's Science and Technology infrastructure. A large number of you have responded to the survey. The results are due August 31 and CCA has been working diligently to produce its report in such a short time.

We are currently working on the Annual General Meeting. You will find in this mailing information regarding the Symposium on Water, the Business Meetings, the Induction Ceremony, and the Awards Banquet.

Finally, I am happy to report that RSC now has 30 Institutional members - 29 universities (Dalhousie University being the latest addition) and NRC Canada. We hope that a few more universities will join over the next year, and that other, non-university organizations will also join.

## **The Barber Award, in honour of Clarence L. Barber (1917-2004)**

Family, friends and colleagues of Dr. Barber have established an endowment fund in honour of his memory. The fund will be used to provide an annual award to an outstanding undergraduate student in the Economics program at the University of Manitoba.

Clarence Barber was a member of the Economics Department at the University of Manitoba for over thirty years, retiring in 1983. His public service included serving on the Manitoba Royal Commission on Flood Cost-Benefit, which established the Winnipeg Floodway, the Royal Commission on Farm Machinery, and the MacDonald Royal Commission on Canada's Economic Union and Development Prospects.

In recognition of his teaching and academic achievements he was elected University Distinguished Professor and University Professor Emeritus, and awarded an honorary doctorate from the University of Guelph. In further testimony to his work, Dr. Barber was elected to the Royal Society of Canada and was named an Officer of the Order of Canada and the Order of Manitoba.
